# A woman\* was killed

## We wonder why, we wonder why...

Another woman was killed in Berlin, in Germany, in 2021. We wonder why.

We wonder why when a woman is killed, it is not said "*a woman was killed*" but a woman *died*.

We wonder why when a woman is killed, the media talks about the suffering of the perpetrator: his social condition, how much his neighbours liked him, his lost work, or his intimate relation with her, as if it was a natural consequence.

We wonder why the media doesn't say: a woman was killed because she was a woman.

A feminicide is the killing of a body read as a woman\*: those who have to love untill death, those who have to care untill death, those who have to obey untill death, because that's love, that's family, that's private.

We wonder why the killing of a woman is not a public issue but a private one, why the killing of a woman has to do with passion and not with hate, why the killing of a women is not an outrage to our society as a whole.

We are here because we are concerned, because we care, because it's outrageous. Because we don't want to forget that many died and we don't want it to happen any more. Against it, we as society, have to assume that our collective responsibility. It is not an issue between men and women, it is not private, it is public and political.

We want public responsibility, from public and social policies to media messages, from education to social relationships and language.

We are here because we want us alive!
